If the committee declares it admissible, it will then examine the substance of your petition.


The Committee on Petitions will write to you directly to inform you of its decision on admissibility.

If your petition is declared admissible, the aforementioned committee will examine it at a meeting open to the public in accordance with the provisions of the European Parliament's internal Rules of Procedure. However, if you would prefer your petition to be considered confidentially at a meeting held in camera, please notify your request to the aforementioned committee immediately.

May I draw your attention to the fact that the procedure for the examination of a petition may be fairly lengthy, given the large number of petitions that we receive which have to be translated into all the official languages of the European Union and then examined by the Committee on Petitions.
