David Cameron MP has passed to me your letter of 7 December 2005, as I am the Conservative Spokesman on Constitutional Affairs.

I understand that you are concerned on behalf of Mr Grant, who was imprisoned for breach of an injunction. You mentioned that Mr Justice Toulson made the Order of Imprisonment and that the firm which acted on the other side was one in which Mr Justice Toulson's brother was a partner. It is not said that he was acting in this particular case. However, if you have any details of evidence suggesting misbehaviour by the Judge, perhaps you could let me have them.

This is a very old case and not likely to be appealed. I notice that the European Court of Human Rights have rejected the claim. It would therefore only be if you could show clear evidence of misbehaviour by the Judge that I would be able to raise this matter with the Lord Chancellor.
